National tests for 2025

Year 1

In June, all children in Year 1 take part in a national phonics screening check. The purpose of the check is to confirm that all children have learned phonics decoding to an age-appropriate standard. Please click on the link below to access the phonics screening information for parents:

Year 4

In June, all children in Year 4 take part in the national multiplication check (MTC). The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12 x 12, which is essential for future success in maths. We now have Times Table Rock Stars in place to support children with learning their tables and we have purchased 30 new ipads so children can regularly practice at school. Please support your child to practice on Times Table Rock Stars at home.

Year 6

Year 6 children take end of Key Stage 2 national curriculum tests in reading, maths and GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling). These are known as SATs. SATs week is Monday 12th to Thursday 15th May 2025.

School Assessments

As part of our assessment procedures, we now use NTS tests at the end of each term (Autumn, Spring and Summer) to assess Years 3 – 5 children in reading, maths and GPS (grammar, spelling and punctuation). Year 2 are assessed in reading and maths using the NTS tests. Little Wandle assessments are also used for phonics assessment.

Uniform

Please ensure children come to school in the correct uniform. Long hair needs to be tied back. The only jewellery children should be wearing are earring studs and a watch. However, smart watches are not allowed in school. Children need to be able to take their earrings out for PE.

Toys and cards

Please do not allow your child to bring in toys or cards to school (e.g. football/Pokémon cards). They cause arguments and children get upset if they are lost or broken. If they are brought in to school, teachers will keep hold of them until the end of the school day and return them to parents. Thank you for your support with this.

Reading

Reading is so important as being able to read, at an age-appropriate level or higher, ensures that children can access all areas of the curriculum. Please hear your child read daily and read to them daily. Please record this in your child's reading record. We check these regularly. Thank you for your support with this.

Scooters and bikes

It is very busy at the school gates, and on the school site, during drop off and pick up. Children have been reminded that they are not to ride their bikes and scooters in the school grounds. We ask that parents support us with this. If children repeatedly ignore reminders, then they will not be able to bring their bike or scooter into school.
