Dear Parents/Carers

There has been a lot going on in school this half-term! Year 1 children have completed the statutory phonics screening check and Year 4 completed the statutory Multiplication Tables Check. The Year 6 writing 'at expected' is looking extremely positive, so a massive thank you to all of our Year 6 children, Mrs Bartram and Mrs Page for all their hard work on writing this year. The SATS results for Year 6 children will be sent out with the reports on Monday 14th July.

A big thank you to Mrs Shingfield for organising the Year 2 residential, and to Mrs Faulkner, Mrs Barker, Miss Applegate and Mrs Andrews for accompanying the children. The children had a great time! Coming up, we have the Year 2/Year 6 visit to the Norfolk Show, the Year 3 visit to Pensthorpe and the Yr 1 visit to the beach. We also have Sports Days to look forward to.

On Friday, parents were emailed about the teaching arrangements for September and the information about transition day on Tuesday 17th June. Your child should have brought home a slip yesterday to say which teacher they will have next year.

As we are now part of Sapientia, we have a new Attendance Policy. It is attached to the email. Please be aware that leave of absence from school will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. Family holidays are not generally considered an exceptional circumstance. The school register is a legal document, and we have to ensure that the codes entered for absences are accurate. Please do not tell us your child is ill if you are actually on holiday. If we have evidence that this is the case, then the register code will need to be changed, the absence will be amended to unauthorised and there may be a referral for a Fixed Penalty Notice. Please find attached the NCC leaflet about FPNs which we sent to parents last year. There is a very clear link between children's attendance and their attainment, so it is important that parents aim for their child's attendance to be 96% or above. Thank you for your support with this.

We ask that parents do not ring the gate buzzer before 8.40am. The office opens at 8.40am -when the gates open - and the office staff will be able to deal with any queries then. At home time, please wait for the gates to open before coming into the office for general queries.

Please do not allow your child to bring in toys or cards from home. This causes upset if they are lost and are often the cause of arguments in school.

We have had some very hot days recently. When it is hot, please apply suncream to your child before they come to school and ensure they have a hat and a water bottle.

If you smoke or vape, we politely ask that you don't do this while waiting at the gates to pick children up or drop children off. We have had a complaint about this as local residents need walk past- some with babies. In the mornings, our pupils are waiting at the gates, and we want to prevent them being affected by adults smoking. Thank you for your support with this.

Many thanks to the Friends. They have organised a disco (Friday 27th June) and the Year 6 prom (Friday 4th July). The Friends's letter gives full details.

By the end of this term, we hope our new website will go live and we will also be having new signage.

The week was kickstarted with an assembly held by RBL Branch Secretary Jennie Stevens on remembrance, bravery and unity. On Wednesday the children were invited to school in optional World War Two style dress. It was lovely to see such a great uptake on this and the effort children had gone to with their costumes. On Friday, we had some very special assemblies throughout the afternoon. The children heard from a number of veterans who we invited into school including: Carl Brandwood, Tyrone Power, Steve Tuffen and RBL chairman Gareth Stevens, as well as active serviceman in the RAF Sgt. Jonathan Todd. We were also lucky enough to have Vera Staines (a military wife) as well as members of the Edwards family leading the assemblies too. Hearing these individuals' stories and experiences first hand is invaluable for the children's understanding of the bravery and sacrifice of those who not only serve in the Armed Forces but also the members of their families too. As always, we are incredibly grateful to the RBL for their support in facilitating these experiences for our children.

Pupil Asset Update

In September we are moving away from Pupil Asset to a new management information system called Bromcom. We are currently in the process of setting this up **so please do not** make any more amendments to your child's records (amend address, phone number etc) as the data we currently hold will be transferred to the new system.

If you have any changes of contact information, please inform the school office as soon as possible.

We will also be changing the way parents/carers pay for meals and trips using the new system but this change will not be in place until September so please continue to use Pupil Asset until we have further details of the new system which we will pass to you as soon as we know.

Attendance - late arrival and late collection

The gates open at **8.40am** and close at **8.50am**. Children arriving after the gates have closed need to go through the office. We ask that parents ensure children arrive at school before the gates close, so they are not marked as late. We also have several children who are late being collected. Children need to be collected at **3.25pm** please. Teachers often have meetings to attend as soon as school finishes. Many thanks for your support with this.

GENERAL REMINDERS

Toys and cards

Please do not allow your child to bring in toys or cards to school (e.g. football/Pokémon cards). They cause arguments and children get upset if they are lost or broken. If they are brought in to school, teachers will keep hold of them until the end of the school day and return them to parents. Thank you for your support with this. The only exception is for children who have an SEN plan and a fidget toy is listed as a strategy.

Scooters and bikes

It is very busy at the school gates, and on the school site, during drop off and pick up. Children have been reminded that they are not to ride their bikes and scooters in the school grounds. We ask that parents support us with this. If children repeatedly ignore reminders, then they will not be able to bring their bike or scooter into school.

Uniform

Please ensure children come to school in the correct uniform. Long hair needs to be tied back. The only jewellery children should be wearing are earring studs and a watch. However, smart watches are not allowed in school. Children need to be able to take their earrings out for PE.

Smoking/Vaping

We are a non-smoking site. We also request that parents move away from the gates if they wish to smoke or vape, while waiting for the gates to open. This is to prevent other parents and children from being affected by smoking in the queue. We would really appreciate parents' support with this.

Club attendance

If your child is not attending a club that they are normally booked into, please let the office know. This is so our records can be updated. A register is taken at each club, and we do need to know in advance if children are not attending.
