Year 6 visit to Duxford Imperial War Museum

Year 6 had a brilliant day out at Duxford Imperial War Museum on Wednesday. We saw the airfield constantly in use, many amazingly restored aircraft such as the B-17 Flying Fortress, SR-71 Blackbird and got to take a look inside a Spitfire. We also got to climb on board a Concorde and see all of the different control panels, which was very special! In the Battle of Britain display, we got to go inside an Anderson Air Raid Shelter which we have recently read about in our English text, Goodnight Mr Tom. One of the highlights of our trip was attending a talk from two veterans who both served in the RAF - one of whom was alive during WW2 - and ask them questions about their experiences of war. Our trip has helped us to better our understanding of World War Two and has inspired us to do some fantastic writing since we have returned!

Year 6 Residential Trip

The Year Six children had a fantastic time on their weeklong residential trip to Caythorpe Court in Lincolnshire. They worked well as a team and tackled different individual challenges too. Over the week, they participated in raft building and canoeing, laser tag, rock climbing, abseiling, rifle shooting, zip wire, tunnel trail, trapeze, vertical challenge and orienteering. At night, we sang songs and ate marshmallows over a campfire, played ambush and balloon splash and even celebrated with a silent disco! The children behaved brilliantly, and friendships were formed. It was a special week that we will never forget!













Year 5 Science Cambridge trip

On Thursday 16th October, Year 5 visited the Cambridge Science Centre for the morning, located in Cambridge Science Park. We were very excited to explore the wide-ranging hands-on activities in the Explore Room which sparked our curiosity for all things science! Exhibits included reflecting and refracting light; building paper airplanes and launching them through hoops; investigating the energy needed to power different electrical items around the home and even exploring how all life began from simple forms billions of years ago. Each class also engaged in a workshop where they made model land-yachts. Starting from the same base design, children were each given a piece of A4 paper and three sticks to create a sail for their land-yacht. There were some fantastic designs which children then tested to see which went the furthest - we even got to bring them home! A fantastic day exploring real-life science in a hands-on way; lots of great scientific thinking throughout the morning!

Taster session for Year 6

Last Friday, the Year 6s went to Attleborough Academy for a taster day with other primary schools. Our lessons included conducting an experiment in science using fire, performing a Greek myth in drama, showing off our ICT skills on scratch and creating beautiful water colour masterpieces in art. The day finished with each group presenting what they had learnt. We had some very brave children standing up and performing on stage and we are now all looking forward to our next transition activities!

Year 4 trip to Ancient House

On Thursday, we went on the train to Ancient House in Thetford to learn more about the Romans. One of our activities was making Mosaics which are patterns that were for poor and wealthy homes. They could go on walls, floors and ceilings. We learnt about battles and what they wore. We also discovered how we know about Roman life today and the food they ate. Everyone found going to Ancient House very much fun!



Attendance

A reminder that the gates open at 8.40am and close at 8.50am. Children who arrive after 8.50am need to go through the office and will be marked as late. If your child is absent from school, please let the school office know as soon as possible on the morning the absence. If we do not hear from parents by 9.20am, we will start our first day calling procedures. If we cannot contact parents, we will make a home visit.



Attendance - late arrival and late collection

The gates open at **8.40am** and close at **8.50am**. Children arriving after the gates have closed need to go through the office. We ask that parents ensure children arrive at school before the gates close, so they are not marked as late. We also have several children who are late being collected. Children need to be collected at **3.25pm** please. Teachers often have meetings to attend as soon as school finishes. Many thanks for your support with this.

GENERAL REMINDERS

Toys and cards

Please do not allow your child to bring in toys or cards to school (e.g. football/Pokémon cards). They cause arguments and children get upset if they are lost or broken. If they are brought in to school, teachers will keep hold of them until the end of the school day and return them to parents. Thank you for your support with this. The only exception is for children who have an SEN plan and a fidget toy is listed as a strategy.

Scooters and bikes

It is very busy at the school gates, and on the school site, during drop off and pick up. Children have been reminded that they are not to ride their bikes and scooters in the school grounds. We ask that parents support us with this. If children repeatedly ignore reminders, then they will not be able to bring their bike or scooter into school.

Uniform

Please ensure children come to school in the correct uniform. Long hair needs to be tied back. The only jewellery children should be wearing are earring studs and a watch. However, smart watches are not allowed in school. Children need to be able to take their earrings out for PE.

Smoking/Vaping

We are a non-smoking site. We also request that parents move away from the gates if they wish to smoke or vape, while waiting for the gates to open. This is to prevent other parents and children from being affected by smoking in the queue. We would really appreciate parents' support with this.

Club attendance

If your child is not attending a club that they are normally booked into, please let the office know. This is so our records can be updated. A register is taken at each club, and we do need to know in advance if children are not attending.
