## Some key points




#### Attleborough

Our settlement is a small town in a rural area. There are some shops and buildings but not as many as in an urban city. We are surrounded by farmland.

- The planet we live on, Planet Earth, is split into seven areas of land-the continents.
- Between the continents are five oceans.
- We live in the United Kingdom which is made up of four countries: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- Each country in the UK has their own 'national flower': the rose (England); the thistle (Scotland); the daffodil (Wales) and the shamrock (Northern Ireland).
- The nearest sea to us is the North Sea, which is where you might go for a paddle in Norfolk!

### Where we live:

We live in the **united Kingdom** which is an island within the continent of **Europe**. The UK has four countries: **England**, **Scotland**, **Wales** and **Northern Ireland**. The capital city of England is **London**. We live in England. Each country is split up into smaller areas called counties. The county we live in is **Norfolk**.

#### The united Kingdom (UK):

The countries within the UK all have different characteristics, some of which they are well-known for. Here are some examples:

<u>England</u>: Beautiful countryside and the Royal Familiu!

<u>Scotland</u>: Lots of mountains, tartan and The Loch Ness Monster!

<u>Wales</u>: The highest mountain in Wales, Mount Snowdon and the Welsh language (spoken by many people in Wales).

Northern Ireland: Giant's Causeway!
